MORE ABOUT CANADIAN PHILATELIC LITERATURE

In my article in TOPICS for July, I mentioned two editions for Lowe's Catalogue, distinguished by their covers, but I could not be more specific as I possessed only the red-jacketed edition at the time. Now, through the kindness of Robert J. Duncan (BNAPS # 37), I have both editions, the second being bound in orange-colored cloth.

Although both editions show, on their respective title pages, that they were copyrighted in 1925, actually the orange book is a revision prepared during October or November, 1928; the two lowest values of the then new Scroll Issue are listed (they appeared in October), but not the remainder of the set (which was issued in December, and in January, 1929).

In Popular Stamps for September columnist Phil Atts suggests that we "might have added the B. N. A. section of the publications of The Philatelic Society of London issued in 1889. This is not often seen around and commands a high price. Kohl's Handbook No. 4 (in German) also has considerable specialized Canadian material."

Of the P. S. L. publication I must confess that I know nothing. The Kohl Handbook I simply forgot, but I might have omitted it in any case, as it would be of value to so few, and it's possible that there are many other good studies of Canadian stamps available in foreign languages.

I should add, though, that the current Billing's handbooks occasionally contain material of Canadian interest, and collectors are advised to watch the advertisements of this series, checking the list of contents of new volumes added. Type 2 booklet existence doubted, further information is desired.

Type 3 is a booklet with a two piece buff cover, 5 panes of 4 stamps each, and 5 interleafs. The panes consist of one pane of 1c #183 stamps, three panes of 2c #185 stamps, and one pane of 3c #187 stamps for a total of 40c. The booklet is held together by two wire staples at the left of the cover and the stamps are stapled through the top margin in such a manner that the bottom of the stamp is again to the right. The stamps in the booklet are line perf 13 x 13.

Type 4 booklet has a light yellow one-piece cover which is folded in half and the five panes of 4 stamps each are set inside the fold and held in place with one wire staple. The stamps used are one pane of the 1c #184, three panes of the 2c #186, and one pane of the 3c #187 for a total of 40c. These stamps are comb perf 13¼ x 13¼ and they are set in so that the bottom of the stamp is toward the right. This booklet however contains only four interleaves. The sequence follows:

Type 4A has the same stamps and the same number of panes as Type 4 but they differ in the following details. The buff cover is two-piece and held in place by two staples. The stamps differ too in that they are line perf $13\frac{1}{3}\times13\frac{1}{3}$. The same number of interleaves are used but they are in different order. The sequence follows:

A NEW BRUNSWICK "WHODUNIT."

Several years ago I acquired a lot of New Brunswick covers, all bearing the five cent green, and mailed from North Head, Grand Manau to Woodstock. All were singles, except three legal size envelopes each with pairs making the ten cent rate. All three of these were mailed within the same month in 1866, and each shows the dispatching and receiving town postmarks. However, one, and only one is additionally handstamped "Insufficiently Paid 7 Cents," a marking listed in Jarrett. Although there is no evidence that the particular cover was registered, one can only conclude that the marking indicates the fact. If not so, why was it applied?

All this leads to an inquiry of our member readers. Does the New Brunswick seventeen cent black, Scott # 10 exist genuinely used on cover? If so, do the markings indicate use for registry? I have not seen one in dealers' hands or offered at auction in fifteen years of collecting. I would appreciate an article throwing light on the use of this elusive stamp.
