With this newsletter I enclose photocopies of my research into the 19th century duplexes of ONTARIO with a few early 20th century which may have been used in 1890's. Not included are KINGSTON, PETERBORO, HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY, ONT., ST. THOMAS type I, WINDSOR type I, TORONIO, TORONIO STREETS, OTTAWA, HAMILTON, LONDON and BERRI's, the simple reason, I have more work to do on these and hope to have them completed for our next newsletter.

The purpose of these photocopies is to have you update my information and hopefully yours as well, my period of use is nowhere complete as I have adopted the attitude, if I haven't seen it, it doesn't exist. Also my dater measurements differ in some cases with Smythies, after having measured hundreds in the last two years, I have come to the conclusion that as a result of over and under inking there has been some confussion, my measurements are based on measuring from the middle of the outside circle line to the middle of its opposite.

On several pages, I have commented that a certain strike appears similar to another but with or without timemarks. Can anyone provide proof that in these cases they are not the same hammer?

To those to whom I owe letters regarding information they have sent you will find a personal letter enclosed with this newsletter.

Please do take the time to write and send photocopies where possible of additions. I will change my records and keep on file.
