In our last newsletter we illustrated a Hanover Bll with re-worked killer bars, I note Dalpe/Walker have listed this in the PHSC Journal with usage 1936/10/19 until 1940/01/05, we can now report 1934/10/22 early date.

We note a similar re-worked killer bars for MERRITON Bll, two examples illustrated, anyone else have examples outside these dates?



A small sideline project I have is to determine the earliest and latest dates for the various types of issued hammers, i.e. A9, B9, B10, B11, R7, S7, P7, Q7. The Berri's have been handled earlier and are under ongoing revision.

Here are a few dates I have noted.

A9 - (the one common in 1900-1910 period) 1898/01/31 - 1945/10/45.

Bll - 1908/07/23 -

B9 - 1926/01/25 -

B10 - 1926/06/22 -

N7 - 1929/08/10 -

07 - 1929/10/12 -

P7 - 1950/01/19 -

Q7 - 1945/07/26 -

R7 - 1950/02/01

S7 - 1948/02/19 -

Several B types still in use, at least four on a daily basis, the oldest 74 years old.

There are examples of N-R types still in use. Can anyone add earlier dates and confirm which ones are still in use?

That is it for this one, more sooner than later.
