Illustrated are four of the new listings along with examples of two hammers from which we have separated Grand Forks & Moose Jaw, the latter thanks to Jim Karr.



As a result of splitting DBC-146 & DSA-544 we are anxious to have new reports for these as we have had to eliminate our previous data.

While it is normal to assume where there are two or three different hammers of the same type for a town in the proof books, that the use of the earlier hammer ceased when a new one became available. This is not always the case. I recently had a report for DBC-16 ANYOX, proofed 1915/09/02, the report was 1930/11/07, at first glance one would think the reporter had made a mistake and that the report was for DBC-17 proofed 1922/05/16. Not so! The following are from the proof books, again I would appreciate fresh reports for these hammers in case we have them confused.



I have been asked to explain the difference between DBC-249 & DBC-250 NEW WESTMINSTER A9's. The lettering is very similar, both being thin letters. The easiest way is to measure \hat{N} E \hat{W} W E S T M I N S T E \hat{R} top tip of the 'N' to top tip of the 'R', DBC-249 is 18mm, DBC-250 is 20mm.

If there are other hammers giving you trouble drop me a note and I will try to help, good sharp photocopies should accompany so that I can compare with what I have.

Illustrated below is a CHATHAM/C.W. -/DE 24/77 type I, A13. If this hammer was manufacured by Berri we would have a new listing as we only show PM at the moment. Smythie lists a hammer in the Ontario section of his 2nd edition book, page 21, with C.W., noting 1872-1878 usage. Why would the P.O. issue a hammer with C.W. five years after confederation? Note the latest recorded date of use of the PM hammer is 1871/09/05. Perhaps it broke and they dug out this previously unused BLANK hammer? ANY THOUGHTS ON THIS ONE?



MONTREAL/CANADA 'S' in wavy line killer DPQ-632 is listed as type U7 proofed 1954/08/21, this proof strike is not on my microfilm. While I have never received a report on this hammer I do have a similar report but type $\overline{17}$ 1955/09/25, can anyone confirm the proof strike type?

Finally, several false or unconfirmed unofficial duplexes have come across my desk. These are illustrated below, I am looking for confirming strike!
