DON-1206 OTTAWA - 'FREE', illustr. below are two examples an 1881 strike with 'FREE' killer lined up at 3 o'clock and perfectly horiz. to the dater, the second an 1884 strike with the 'FREE' killer dipping towards the bottom of the dater, both 7.5mm apart. Fred Stulburg makes mention of this alignment in an article in The Canadian Philatelist vol. 27 page 381 & 383, although does not provide an illustration of the misaligned. I would appreciate photocopies of other misaligned examples. If this is a revolving type it should be listed under UNOFFICIALS.



This then leads to the question, are DON-1204 (dater & killer 4.5mm apart) & DON-1206 the same hammer, that is to say dater & killer on a revolving sliding track, what we need to find is DON-1204 misaligned. Please check all your Ottawa strikes with the free killer.

DON-905 & DON-906, in the proof books there are two examples of LONDON/ONT All hammer dated NO 20/78, I had at first thought it was simply two strikes of the same hammer, however, I now feel there are two hammers. DON-905 the two legs of first 'N' do not intersect. DON-906 the two legs of first 'N' intersect at lower edge of dater.

DON-1214 OTTAWA/ONT proofed 1942/07/23 and listed as type '07' is either an error in type or we have a new 'Q7' hammer as my illustration to the right will confirm. Can anyone send me a photocopy of '07' hammer?



TORONTO NUMERAL '1' DUPLEXES

Following is an attempt to separate, what on the surface, may seem to be a complicated group of hammers. I hope with the aid of a few keys in this article, they will become much easier to identify.

First, the hammer will have either a 9-bar horiz. or a 7-bar vert. killer.

Lets deal with the $\underline{\text{horiz.}}$ killers. The dater will have either CANADA or ONT. at $\underline{\text{the bottom.}}$

If $\underline{\mathsf{ONT}}$ there are only two hammers $\mathtt{DON-1710}$ or $\mathtt{DON-1716}$, the distinguishing features are -

DON-1710 - much smaller lettering, legs of 'R' almost as wide as the loop, thick stem & base of '1'. Much more common than DON-1716.

DON-1716 - proofed 1881/04/09, an earlier date would be DON-1710, larger lettering, legs of 'R' noticeably wider than loop, thin stem & base of 'l'.

If CANADA at bottom, it will have side dots or no side dots. If it has side dots it is either DON-1722 or DON-1723.

DON-1722 - proofed 1887/12/10, large lettering, squat loop, narrower legs of 'R' than loop, base of '1' 4mm long, stem 3mm long, CANADA 21mm long, space between 'T & C' $5.5 \, \mathrm{mm}$, squat second '0'.

DON-1723 - proofed 1887/12/11, large lettering, legs of 'R' same width as loop, base of '1' 4mm long, stem 3mm long, CANADA 21.5mm long, space between 'T & C' 3.5mm.

If \underline{no} side dots, could be DON-1717, DON-1718, DON-1721 or $\underline{DON-1724}$.

DON-1717 - proofed 1881/04/16, 23mm dater, wider 'R' than DON-1718, a line drawn up the back of 'D' lines up with back of 'R'.

DON-1718 - proofed 1881/04/15, 23mm dater, narrower 'R' than DON-1717, a line drawn up the back of 'D' passes through first 'O' of Toronto, prominent break in dater ring at 9 o'clock from 1881/11/14.

DON-1721 - 25mm dater, large lettering, squat loop of 'R' with legs of 'R' wider than loop, CANADA 20.5mm long.

DON-1724 - 24mm dater, large lettering, legs of 'R' same width as loop, CANADA 19mm long, prominent break in dater ring at 8 o'clock from 1886/01/11.

Now for the <u>vert.</u> bar killers. It will have maltese crosses, side dots or no side dots.

If it has $\underline{\text{maltese crosses}}$, then it is DON-1729, DON-1731 or DON-1733.

DON-1729 - larger maltese crosses than DON-1731, legs of 'R' same width as loop, dater & killer do not touch.

DON-1731 - smaller maltese crosses than DON-1729 or DON-1733, legs of $\mbox{'R'}$ wider than loop, dater & killer touch with 6mm join, scarcest of the three.

DON-1733 - larger maltese crosses than DON-1731, similar to DON-1729, leg of 'R' same width as loop, dater & killer touch (may be DON-1729 repaired), most common of the three.

If it has side dots than it is DON-1725 (DON-1727 has been delisted.

If it has <u>no</u> side dots or maltese crosses, it will be either DON-1720, DON-1720A (new listing) or DON-1735. If prior to 1888/09/05 than it is <u>not</u> the latter.

DON-1720 - loop of 'R' squatter than DON-1720A, third 'O' almost oval, dater & killer $\frac{1}{2}mm$ apart, a line along left leg of first 'A' of Canada passes well below third 'O' of Toronto touching top of numeral '1' in killer. The most common of the three.

DON-1720A - new listing, dater & killer almost touch, a line along left left of first 'A' of Canada passes through third 'O' of Toronto and extends well above numeral '1' in killer.

DON-1735 - proofed 1888/09/05, smaller lettering than DON-1720 or DON-1720A, straight leg of 'R' and wider than loop, dater & killer ½mm apart, a line along left leg of first 'A' of Canada pases just below third 'O' of Toronto and extends to top of circle enclosing numeral '1'. Only example recorded has TM/DAY MONTH/YEAR while the other two hammers have MONTH DAY/TM/YEAR.
