We have a letter from Dave Lacelle of the Fancy Cancel Study Group pertaining to a duplex of Little Current, Ont. reported to E. A. Smythies back in 1963. We quote -

May I please direct a rather obscure question to your study group. I have run across a reference in Maple Leaves 'Duplex Corner', Aug. '63 pg. 226:

"Mr. Littlefield also reports a new and very interesting duplex from Little Current, ONT. 1890 with an unusual dater and killer, see accompanying illustration, which can be described in the Duplex Code as: ONT 25 mm. 8 p.m. H.7. (1) l.e. the killer with a small 1 in circle in an oval of seven broken bars. It rather resembles the Woodstock Ont. duplex of 1887, illustrated in the 2nd. edition on Plate XI figs. 6 and ".

Unfortunately the "accompanying illustration" never appeared in the magazine, and I have never seen any further reference to this duplex.

My question - does it exist? Could you please include this query in your next newsletter?

Can anyone help? Does anyone know of the existance of this postmark? Ontario town postmark collectors please check your holdings for Little Current. It would be a great item to be able to report.




