WELCOME to the CANADA PRECANCEL STUDY GROUP

The collecting and study of Canadian Precancels has been a philatelic specialty for many decades. Although it has not had a high profile, a dedicated few individuals have undertaken to research, record and publish a meaningful amount of information about these stamps that had cancels printed on them before being issued, primarily for use by businesses. As a result, now there is a Canada Precancel Handbook, a periodic Standard Canada Precancel Catalogue (SCPC) and several other works available to assist the collector.

Thanks for the results of these efforts are due to a fairly short list of contributors, many of whom are identified in the Handbook. Unfortunately, we have lost some of these pioneers and others are in the process of giving up their Precancel collecting. Consequently, there is a need for a new breed of specialists to take up the banner and continue the work.

Fortunately, there are still many areas to be studied and research results to be published. Under the BNAPS banner, the Canada Precancel Study group is adopting the following purpose: to focus attention and provide leadership in the continuation of research, communication, and promotion of Canadian Precancels. In doing so, it will undertake to exploit new advances in technology in support of this purpose.

Duncan MacDonald has agreed to serve as Secretary-Treasurer; Larry Goldberg

has agreed to serve as Newsletter Editor. The addresses of these two volunteers are listed elsewhere in this first Newsletter. We are also fortunate to have three individuals who have volunteered to serve as the first Research Coordinators, but more about that in a moment.

Several areas have been suggested in which meaningful research can be done, including the following.

1 Pricing. With the passing of H.G. "Geoff" Walburn, the Editors of the SCPC (Jim Kraemer and Hans Reiche) will welcome some assistance in their ongoing revision of catalogue values which was an area in which Geoff made an essential contribution. Dave Marasco has agreed to coordinate this extremely important area and will be seeking the assistance of all Study Group members to provide him with current information about prices and quantities. He will supply Jim and Hans with this information for their future updates of the SCPC.

2 Internet Usage. The omnipresent impact of the Internet on our lives offers us the opportunity to dramatically improve our Communications amongst ourselves and to increase the Promotion of Precancels within the BNAPS community and throughout the philatelic world. Duncan MacDonald has offered to coordinate the development of the Internet as a tool to support us and will serve as our Webmaster. The first

results of his effort are now available and access addresses are listed elsewhere. He will also liaise with Larry Goldberg to ensure that all pertinent information on the Web Site is made available to all members.

3 Major Users. Since the Precancel was primarily created to support businesses, it is appropriate that further research be undertaken into the Major Users of the service. Norm Wagner has agreed to coordinate the study of this aspect of precancels, an area about which little has been published to date.

4 Precancel Printing. Further review of the printing equipment and processes, time periods, quantities, and plates overprinted, particularly of the City Types, seems to be in order. Detail of this background information is skimpy and yet it is very important in many aspects of identification and pricing.

5 Small Queens. Recent efforts of the Small Queen Study Group to improve the listing of the various printings and major shades on these stamps, offers an opportunity to improve the listing of precancels.

6 Admirals. Similarly, the current listings of the many Admiral varieties are very rudimentary. A good start has been made with the 1-cent yellow and 3-cent carmine types, but there are sparse references

to the basic shades of the 4 cent, 7 cent, and 10 cent. There is an opportunity to examine the range of basic shades and papers of the Admirals and to formulate a consistent list of well-established sub-types with precancels. Perhaps they can eventually be included in the SCPC.

7 Bar Types. This continues to be the most difficult area to understand. Inability to properly identify the correct bar type frequently leads to misrepresentation and this can be serious as many of the bar types have high catalogue values. While many of our advanced specialists can identify bar types with ease, it is not an area which is well-documented and it also contains many unresolved variations such as the R, S and T types.

8 City Types. There continues to be difficulty in identifying City Types. The SCPC does not provide a consistent method of measurement of the different types, especially in the major cities. A more rigorous set of defined measurements would be of assistance and might reduce the number of reported "new" finds.

9 Type 21 Precursor. While most collectors accept the "21" roller cancel as a precursor, it remains unlisted in the SCPC as do many other quasi-precursor rollers. An in-depth review of this area could lead to a listing or else an explanation as to why it remains unlisted.

Other Areas. There are several other areas which have not yet been researched very extensively.

These include perfins, plate blocks, lathe work, re-entries, and revenues. Also, the whole world of postal history is virtually untapped with a start having only been made on Precancelled Stationary.

You may have noticed that the majority of these areas of research do not have a coordinator. I trust that as time goes on, members will identify those areas that interest them and will volunteer to be coordinators.

Membership in the BNAPS Canada Precancel Study Group is open to all BNAPS members for a small fee of \$10 Cdn or \$7 US per year, with January to December being the membership year. Individuals who are not BNAPS members may join for a period of one year, following which they must become BNAPS members to remain in the Group. Kindly forward your membership dues for 2000 to Duncan MacDonald.

I am hopeful that this latest Study Group in the BNAPS stable will be of interest to many members. Precancels are interesting, finite in number, reasonable in price (to the greatest extent) and still realistically available to the average collector. With over 3500 stamps catalogued, approximately half are priced at less than \$50 and scarce examples are still to be discovered in existing collections of Canada. The presence of an active Study Group will fill one of the few voids in this BNA speciality.

The Canada Precancel Study Group (CPSG) website is now in operation.

Come and have a look at what is being developed! This is a new approach for a study group, and we are experimenting with the possibilities offered by on-line communication. Some of this site is available to the general public, and there is a restricted area for members only, which requires a member name and password to enter. If you do not already have a member name and password, contact me, at duncan@camacdonald.com to obtain one.

The unrestricted area contains information that is possibly of interest to the general stamp-collecting public who might be interested in precancels. It contains a section on general information about precancels, a gallery of rare and unusual precancels, a few articles on specific aspects of precancels, precancel dealer information, information on joining BNAPS and the study group and a bibliography of precancel literature. The restricted area contains a membership list, working pages on specific study group projects, members' want/sell/buy/trade lists, and information on upcoming auctions. I am also working on developing a bulletin board to facilitate on-line discussions.

This site has already demonstrated its potential for collaborative action. For example, David Marasco forwarded an article on

"Often Misidentified Town Cancels". I sent David a scan of two stamps that I was having difficulty identifying. David realized he had omitted this area from his article, and within a day had sent a new section for the article with a scan of a pair of stamps illustrating the differences.

So far, David and I have been the primary contributors to the website. We are looking forward to seeing the work that the rest of the study group members are doing and adding to the website, so we can get general comments and assistance from all group members. Please send articles, scans of rare and unusual precancels, or anything else you think would be of interest to the rest of the study group to Duncan for mounting on the website.

It is intended that material contributed by Study Group members will remain in the restricted portion of the website until it has been available through the newsletter for at least one month. On the recommendation of the Chairman of each study area, final articles will then be transferred to the public portion of the website so that other BNAPS members or interested members of the general public can access the information. Members of the study group that do not have access to a computer and the WWW will receive periodic updates of the contents of the website in print form.


Editor




