

OCTOBER 25 MEETING in ARLINGTON

The next meeting of the Prairie Beavers will be held at the offices of Dr. Charles Deur in Arlington: Get on I 30 going to Arlington. If coming from the West, exit on Cooper Street and go right at the end of the ramp (south). There is a Tom's Burgers and Burger King on the southwest corner of the intersection of I 30 and the Cooper Street exit. The first intersection is Road to Six Flags West--go right (west) past the Texaco Station and you will see Arlington Medical Plaza on the right. I am in Suite 105; Texas Oncology--Charles Deur MD should be on the door. If coming from the East on I 30, You will exit Cooper and go on a small loop 180 degrees and come out on the frontage road on the north side of the highway, Lamar. Go right (east) on Lamar to the first stoplight. This is Cooper. Go right on Cooper (south) and cross over I 30, go past Tom's Burgers and Burger King, and turn right after the Texaco station and go right into the second driveway for Arlington Medical Plaza. My office is at the southwest corner of the building. If anyone has trouble following these directions call 817-261-7473 and Charles will rescue you.
