Re-posted the next day with three rare #OX2 Official Seals tied by MONTREAL-BRANCH-DLO double oval handstamps. Also note a Montreal DLO wax seal on back and MITCHAM arrival backstamp on December 8th. The only reported cover with three #OX2 Official Seals.
